

The booklet is to help people work together on the Transforming Care work.


The Transforming Care work is about better care and support for people with learning disabilities and/or autism. The work started after the abuse of people at Winterbourne View.



The Association of Directors of Adult Social Care (ADASS) and NHS England will make another announcement about the Joint Health and Social Care Learning Disability Self-Assessment Framework soon.



Consultations



60% of the 113 bus services in Lancashire that Lancashire County Council (LCC) currently support will still run in some form or other from April.

Lancashire County Council have made £2m funding available to support 28 of these services with 40 to be run on a commercial basis.



Community Engagement



Bill has now left Lancashire County Council.

We gave a presentation to Bill yesterday at Plungington Community Centre where colleagues and self advocates thanked him for his work and we enjoyed coffee and cake.

Consultations



The decision about what services we continue to support was made by the cabinet member after considering the recommendations of a cross-party working group.

LCC's priority wherever possible is to ensure people can still use a bus service to get to work, do their shopping, and access education, health and other important services.

The County Councillors saved Travelcare buses which take people to day services and schools.
